#### **CALL FOR NEW MEMBERS**

As previously advised, the board is seeking applications closing on 8/12/2017 for new members. #### **LODGE UTILISATION**

In April last year The Board formed a Lodge Utilisation Task Team, primarily charged with investigating opportunities to increase the use of Mulubinba Lodge in Summer as well as Winter, and recommending changes to the Board.

- <u>Progress to date includes</u>:

  1. Developed a formula based calculation for Visitor Rates.
- 2. Introduced the SAC SENIOR classification.
- 3. Provided a Linen Service for the winter period.
- 4. Redesigned the Cleaning Schedule.
- 5. Recommended to push membership numbers closer to the 150 limit.

#### Ongoing Actions

- 1. Develop a more rational framework for setting future annual subs.
- 2. Review opportunities to increase lodge usage during summer.
- 3. Review potential expansion of the lodge with upgraded facilities.
- 4. Develop a medium to long term lodge development / maintenance plan with financial budgets.
- Understand the cost implications of changes / upgrades to the lodge and the revenue stream required to deliver such changes.
- 6. Developing a policy to ensure the concept of the SAC Seniors is understood by future Boards. Additionally, the eligibility criteria are being expanded to include spouses who have inherited their membership due to the death of their partners.

## IMPORTANT DATES BEING BROUGHT FORWARD

The Board has agreed to bring forward the Subscription and Winter Priority Bookings dates for the 2018 winter season.

You will now receive your 2018 subs notice in December 2017 and have until the 28<sup>th</sup> February 2018 to pay any outstanding amounts (2018 = \$250 for members). Subs payments received after 28<sup>th</sup> February and before 30<sup>th</sup> April will be \$300, then after this date \$325; as the late payment penalties apply.

The winter priority bookings will now need to be received and paid by 28<sup>th</sup> February 2018 as well. Therefore prompt payment of subs is essential to secure bookings for the winter season. Booking information will be sent out in early January 2018.

Just a reminder that the Wi-Fi at the lodge is available now all year round. Following the successful trial for several winters, the Board has entered into a two year full time contract.

This is a 'Work-In-Progress' which will continue to grow and provide a permanent record for all to enjoy.


